

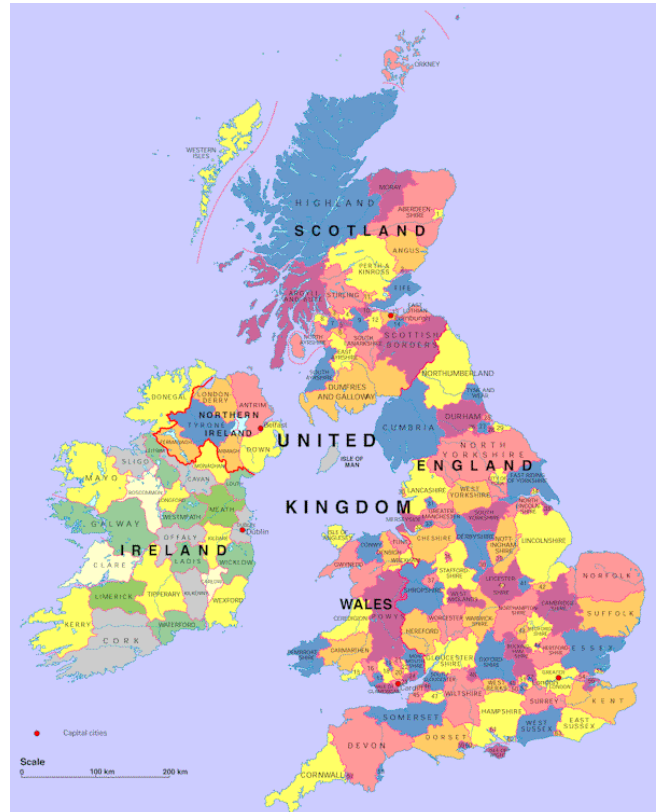
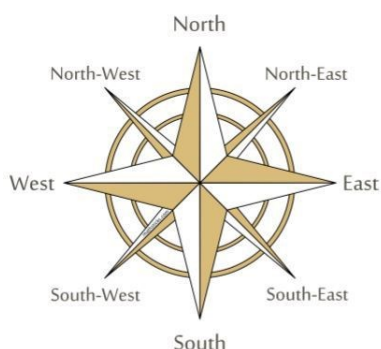
Year 3 Geography: The United Kingdom—counties and cities (half-term)

- The UK is divided into counties which are areas of land that contain cities, towns and villages.
- Cities are large towns where lots of people work and live.
- Physical features are natural; Human features are man-made buildings and objects

- Four Compass Points—North, East, South and West.

Major cities: John O'Groats—Caithness Inverness—Inverness-shire Perth—Perthshire Stirling—Stirlingshire Carlisle—Cumbria Lancaster—Lancashire Warrington—Cheshire Birmingham—West Midlands Gloucester—Gloucestershire Bristol—Gloucestershire Taunton—Somerset Exeter—Devon Penzance—Cornwall Land's End— Cornwall
