




Year 2 Art: Colour Mixing— Henri Rousseau (half-term)

Learning to Recap:

- Artists use their creativity to make artwork. They use different materials (paint, clay) and methods (painting, sculpting)
- Drawing, rubbing, drawing (sketching) and printing are all methods
- Lines can be long, short, straight and curved
- Primary colours are blue, red and yellow. Primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours: green, orange and purple.

New Knowledge and Vocabulary

Henri Rousseau	A French artist (1844-1910)
Tiger in a Tropical Storm	Painted in 1981. This was Rousseau's first jungle painting. The painting includes lots of tones and tints of the colour green.
Tones	Adding black to a colour—darker than the original 
Tints	Adding white to a colour—lighter than the original 
Colour wheels	
Lines	Thin and thick—made by pencil or brush
Pattern	How a surface looks—shown with dots and lines.
Texture	How a surface feels—shown with dots and lines
